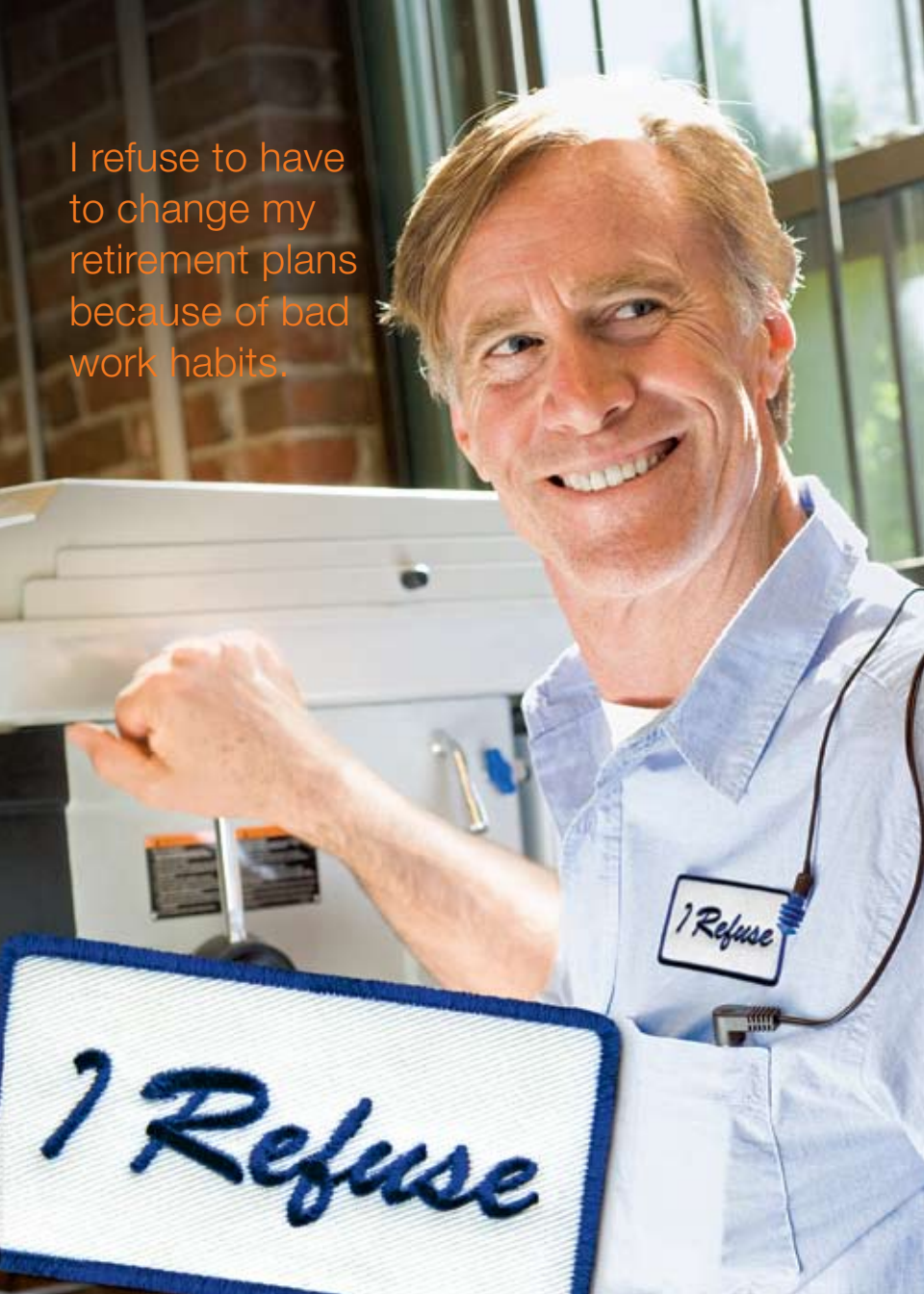


I refuse to have to change my retirement plans because of bad work habits.
